

## Physical Education and School Sport Funding Statement of Intent

The PE and Sport Premium provides ring fenced money to primary schools to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The funding is currently worth £150 million per year and is provided jointly by the Department for Education, the Department of Health and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport.

The prime minister announced in February 2014 that the Government have committed to funding for the Primary PE and Sport Premium to 2020.

In line with the governments priorities for the funding; an improvement in the quality of physical education and physical literacy and an increase in participation levels in competitive sport, Bournville Primary Provision has allocated the funding for 2016/17 as follows:

### 2016/17 Proposed spending

February 2017 – received £4766.00

May 2017 – received £3404.00

As a newly established setting (September 2016) pupils have joined us in YR, Yr1 and Yr3. The focus is to rapidly develop pupils' sense of belonging and community in a new school setting. We intend to build a sense of team spirit through targeted play sessions based around sport during break and lunch. This is expected to raise pupils' participation levels in physical activity and their confidence in working together to succeed.

To facilitate this, Evolve Health Mentors have been commissioned to work with all our pupils on a daily basis at break and lunchtimes and to provide staff CPD in how to provide structured play through sport at break and lunch time.

### Spend

£1500 on sports and play equipment.

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### Impact statement 2016/17

We have seen a significant increase in children's participation in in-school activity as the year has progressed. Evolve Mentors developed children's racket skills, hand-eye co-ordination through catching and throwing activities as well as supporting them to work co-operatively in a range of team building activities.

Building these skills had a positive impact on behaviour, reducing low level incidences, improving pupils' social skills and motivating pupils to participate in competitive sport. We were delighted to engage so many children in the Sports Day at the end of the summer term where children were able to demonstrate their newly acquired skills and interests. We are now in a position to develop inter-school provision working with the Kings Norton Consortium

and will, through the introduction of the new house system provide extended opportunities for in-school competitive activity.

### **2017/2018 Proposed Spending**

Proposed budget £16,000+ as gvt doubled allocation for next two years.

We now have children in YR, Y1, Y2 and Y4. Our continued focus is on building team spirit and pupils' self-confidence. We intend to achieve this through introducing:

**Balanceability** for all year groups - this will teach all pupils to ride a bicycle starting with a balance bike, stabilisers and then a two wheeler. Staff will also receive CPD in how to facilitate this in subsequent years.

**Cost £6000**

**Bikeability** for Year 4 - The scheme is free but to ensure no pupil is disadvantaged the school will purchase some bicycles to ensure all pupils achieve a Level 1 pass

**Cost £1000**

**Sports coaching** – specialist sports coaches will be able to offer specialised extra-curricular clubs for pupils. Initially this will be in gymnastics and football with additional activities to follow

**Cost £1500**

**Chance to Shine** - Warwickshire Cricket Club. Pupils will learn how to play cricket and be coached by specialist players in this Governing Body programme.

**Cost £2,500**

**Sports focussed residential opportunities** - Yr 2 - 1 night residential and Yr 4 a 3 night residential. Sports Premium funding will be allocated to contribute to costs to ensure all pupils have access to this opportunity. The residential activities are sports focussed with an emphasis on team building and confidence building.

**Cost £5000**

**Lunchtime Supervision CPD** – a newly appointed Pastoral Lead will build on the progress already made by providing CPD opportunities for lunchtime supervisors to ensure the current model is sustainable.

### **2018/19 Proposed Spending**

Proposed budget £16,000+ as gvt doubled allocation for next two years.

We now have children in YR, Y1, Y2, Y3 and Y5. Our continued focus is on building team spirit and pupils' self-confidence. We intend to achieve this through continuing to offer:

**Balanceability** to continue – continue to fund resources required for increase in pupil numbers

**Cost £500**

**Bikeability** for Year 5 - The scheme is free but to ensure no pupil is disadvantaged the school will purchase some bicycles to ensure all pupils achieve a Level 2 pass. As pupil numbers increase we may need to increase resource.

**Cost £500**

**Sports coaching** - opportunities available through increasing the range of specialised extra-curricular clubs for pupils. Sports Clubs are likely to include a continuation of gymnastics and football as well as provision of basketball and netball for key Stage Two pupils as they progress through the school.

**Cost £2500**

**Chance to Shine** - Warwickshire Cricket Club. Pupils will learn how to play cricket and be coached by specialist players in this Governing Body programme.

**Cost £2,500**

**Sports focused residential opportunities** - Yr 2 - 1 night residential and Yr 5 a 4 night residential. Sports Premium funding will be allocated to contribute to costs to ensure all pupils have access to this opportunity. The residential activities are sports focussed with an emphasis on team building and confidence building.

**Cost £7000**

**Tag Rugby** - Moseley Rugby Club introduction to tag rugby for Yr 5

**Cost £500**

**Youth Sport Trust membership**

**Cost £200**

**Transport** to enable pupils to attend inter-school competitions
